Here we have to discuss about the importance of LGBTQIA community?
Now we can elaborate the term LGBTQIA

1. LESBIANS - Women who shows romantic and sexual affinity towards women.
2. GAY- Men who shows romantic and sexual affinity towards men.
3. BISEXUAL - People who are sexually attracted not exclusively to people of one particular gender; attracted to both men and women.
4. TRANS GENDER - An umbrella term denoting or relating to a person whose sense of personal identity and gender does not correspond with their birth sex.
5. QUEER-This umbrella term includes people who have non binary ( people whose gender identity doesn't sit comfortably with man or women)

Gender - fluid or gender non- conforming identities. Once considered a pejorative term, queer has been reclaimed by some LGBTQI An+ people to describe themselves. However, it is not a universally accepted term even within the LGBTQIA+ community.
6. QUESTIONING - This term describes someone who's questioning their sexual orientation or gender identity. Sometimes, when Q is seen at the end of LGBT, it can also mean questioning.
7. INTER SEX - An adjective used to describe a person with one or more innate sex characteristics, including genitals, internal reproductive organs, and chromosomes, that fall outside of traditional conceptions of male and female bodies. Inter sex people are assigned a sex at birth - either male or female and that decision by medical providers and parents may not match the gender identity of the child. Not all inter sex folks identify as being part of the LGBTQIA + community.
8. ASEXUAL - This means a person who does not experience sexual attraction. Asexual; and a romantic meaning they experience little to no romantic attraction and or has little to no desire to form romantic relationships

We cannot guarantee a person's gender is going to be the same throughout their life. People have the right to chose their own gender. They have the right to explore their sexuality throughout their life.

In the 21 st century many people around the globe is exploring their sexuality, undergoing surgeries to attain their choice of sexuality. Many People in the world used to believe being a part of LGBTQIA+ is a curse. They were excluded from the box of things that the society considered as "Normal." People refused to get out of their shell and to be open minded. Regard less of the gender and sexuality we all come under the same tree. As year go by many people started to become open minded and people outside the community also started to raise their voice with them.

Each color in the rainbow flag represents each value in the community:

1. PINK: Sexuality
2. RED: Life
3. Orange: Healing
4. GREEN: Nature
5. BLUE: Art
7.INDIGO: Harmony

LGBTQIA history dates backs to the first recorded instance of same-sex love and -sexuality of ancient civilizations involving the history of lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans gender people and cultures around the world. What survives after many centuries of persecution resulting in shame?

In 1994, the annual observance of LGBTQIA+ history month began in the United states, and it has since been picked up in other countries. This observance involves highlighting the history of people. In the United Kingdom it has been observed during February since 2005. A celebrated achievement in LGBTQIA+ history occurred when queen Beatrix signed a law-making Netherlands the first county to legalize same sex marriage.

The Pride Month is celebrated every June as a tribute to those who were involved in the stonewall riots. As a sub holiday during pride month the pride day is celebratedonJune28.The Day marks the date in history when the first pride march was held in New York city in 1970.

However, different communities celebrate pride day on different days throughout June.
The stone wall movement is related to the pride month on a hot summer night in New York onJune28,1969policeraidedthestonewallinn, a gay club in Greenwich village, which resulted in bar patrons, staff, and neighborhood residents rioting on to Christopher street outside. Among many leaders of the riots was black, trans, bisexual, woman, leading the movement to continue over six days with protests and clashes. The message was clear, protest or demanded the establishment of places where LGBTQ+ people could go and be open about their sexual orientation without fear of arrest. The mother of the pride is known as"BRENDA HOWARD." She conducted gay pride week and a liberation day parade a year after stonewall riots.

India have been evolving rapidly in recent years. How ever Indian LGBTQ citizens may face social and legal difficulties not experienced by non -LGBTQIA+ persons.

Even if Article 15 of the constitution prohibits discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity,many legal protections is not exercised such as same sex marriage,etc..

Trans gender people in India are allowed to change their legal gender through post sex reassignment surgery under legislation passed in 2019 and also can register a third gender.

As a result of the strong political movements in favor of LGBTQIA+rights, people are more accepting of same sex relationships, with around three out of four Indians

Supporting them according to an opinion poll. In2010
LGBTQA+ in India increasingly gained tolerance and acceptance, especially in large cities.

However, Kerala has been at the forefront of LGBTQIA+ in India after Tamilnadu. It became one of the first state in India to establish a welfare policy for the trans gender community in 2016.

By the uprising of the LGBTQIA+community the same sex marriage was held in Kerala. Nikesh and Sonu are the first married gay couple from Kerala who got married in 2019.

Nived and Abdul are the secondopenly married couple in state.
Sruthy and Daya, Kerala's first Lesbian-trans couple and recently Adhila and Fathima, Kerala's first lesbian couple.

We have to make some things to support these peoples. Five things that support the LGBTQIA +community:

1. Post space signs
2. Start an LGBTQIA+ organization in our society
3. Stand up against homophobia
4. Integrate LGBTQIA+ topics into the curriculum
5. Pursue professional development.

People around the world face violence and inequality and sometimes get tortured because of who they love,how they look or what they are. Sexual orientation and gender identity are integral aspects of ourselves and should never lead to discrimination or abuse. Human rights works for lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans gender People's rights, and with activists representing a multiplicity of identities and issues. We document and expose abuse based on sexual orientation and gender identity worldwide, including torture, killing, and executions, arrests under unjust laws, unequal treatments, censorship, medical abuses, discrimination in health, jobs, housing, domestic violence, abuse against children and denial family rights and recognition. We advocate for laws and policies that will protect everyone's dignity. We work for a world where all people can enjoy their life fully.

So, we can see how discriminate our world was against something different. People tend to hate the things that is different yet they call the same thing's boring. # Child labor issues And Challenges

Children are future citizens of the Nation and their adequate development is utmost priority of the country. Unfortunately, child labor engulfs children across the world, the world is home to 1.2 billon individuals aged 10-19 years. However, desprle pts menace in various forms, the data shows variation in prevalence of child labor across the Globe and the statistical figures about child labor are very alarming. There are an estimated 86 million child laborers worldwide. The 2001 national census of India estimated total numbers of child labor aged $5-14$ to be at 12.6 million.

Although the constitution of India guarantees free and compulsory education to children between age of 6 to 14 and prohibits employment of children youngers than 14 in 18 hazardous occupations, child labor is still prevalent in the informed sectors of the Indian economy.

Child labor violates human rights, and is in contravention of the International labor organization. About one-third of children of the developing world are failing to complete even 4 years of education.

India population has more than 17.5 million working children in different industries, and incidentally maximum an in agricultural sectors, lather industry, mining and match-making industries, etc...

The term "child labor" is often as world that deprives children of their childhood, their potential and their dignity, and that is harmful to physical-mental development. It refers to work that is mentally, physically, socially, or morally dangerous and harmful to children, and interferes with their schooling by depriving them of the opportunity to attend school, obliging them o leave school prematurely or requiring them to attempt to combine school attendance with excessively long and heavy work. The statistical about child workers in the world have variation because of the differences in defining categories of age group and engagement of child in formal and informal sector.

Child labor continues to be a great concern in many parts of the world. In 2008, some $6 \%$ of the 215 million boys and girls were estimated to be child labors worldwide. Major engagement was

in agricultural sector, followed by fisheries, agriculture, livestock and forestry. In addition to work that interferes with schooling and its harmful to personal development, many of these children work in hazardous occupations activities that are harmful.

Incidentally, $96 \%$ of the child workers are in the developing countries of Africa, Asia and South America, With respect to the child workers between the ages of 5 and 14 . Asia makes up $61 \%$ of child workers in developing countries, while Africa has $02 \%$ and Latin America $7 \%$. Further, while Asia has the highest number of child workers, Africa has the highest prevalence of child labor ( $40 \%$ ).

The policy curbing labor exists but lack of enfor cement of labor restrictions perpetuated child labor. This is manifested in variation in minimum age restriction in different types of employment. The international labor office reports that children work the longest hours and are the worst paid of all labors, In India, the child labor act 1986 and Kerala state that no child shall be employed or permitted to work in any of the occupations set forth in part A of the schedule or in any workshop where in any of the propellers set forth in part B of the schedule is carried
 on. For this purpose, "child" means a person who prohibits employment of children in certain specified hazardous occupations and processes and regulates the working conditions in others. The list of hazardous occupations and processes in progressively being expanded on the recommendation of the child labor Technical Advisory committee constituted under the Act.

Poverty is one of the important factors for this problem. Hence, enforcement alone cannot help solve it. The Government has been laying a lot of emphasis on the rehabilitation of these children and on improving the economic conditions of their families.
Many NDOs like CARE India, Child Rights and You, Global March Against child labor etc.... Have been working to eradicate child labor in India. The child labor can be stopped when knowledge is translated into legislation and action, moving good intention and ideas in to protecting the health of the children. The endurance of young children is higher and they cannot protect against discrimination. Focusing on grass roots strategies to mobilize communities against child labor and reintegration of child workers into their homes and schools has proven crucial to breaking the cycle of child labor. A multidisciplinary approach involving specialists with medical, psychological and socio anthropological level is needed to cuib this evil.

It is in this context that we have to take a relooli at the land mark passing of the Right of children to free and compulsory education (TTE) Act 2009. This marks a historic moment for the children of India. For the first time in India's history, children will be guaranteed their right to quality elementary education by the state with the help of families and communities. The world cannot reach its goal to have every child complete primary school by 2015 without India. Although theses have been significant improvements in the proportion of child from socially disadvantage groups in school gaps still remain. Girls are still less likely to enroll in school than boys; in 2005, for upper primary school (grades 6-8) girls enrollment was still 8.8 points lower than boy's, for scheduled tribes the gender gap was 12.6 point and it was 16 points for schedules caters. RIE provides a life platform to reach the unreached, with specific provisions for disadvantaged groups such as child labors, migrant children, children with special need, or those who have a "disadvantage owing to social, cultural, economical, geographical, linguistic gender or such other factors." Bringing 8million out of school Children in to class at the age-appropriate level with the support to stay in school and succeed poses a major challenge. Substantial efforts are essential dispaiters and ensure quality with equity. Successful implementation of the act would certainly go a long way in eradicating child labor in India.

## INFERIORITY COMPLEX: A DETRIMENTALFORCE

"The greater the feeling of inferiority that has been experienced, the more powerful is the urge to conquest and the more violent the emotional agitation."- Alfred Adler
The Hiroshima uranium bomb, which exploded on August 6, 1945, had an explosive yield of 15,000 tonnes of TNT. By the end of 1945, it had destroyed and burned almost $70 \%$ of all buildings, resulting in an estimated 140,000 fatalities and raising rates of cancer and chronic illnesses among the survivors.


The atomic bomb is just one of many weapons that have wreaked havoc on modern society. Instead of working to bring about world peace, countries are focusing on building up their nuclear arsenals.

Ironically, many countries that advocate for world peace actually keep their distance and do nothing to promote peace. Despite UN's best efforts, neither the nation's interrelationships with other countries nor the situation of global wellbeing have significantly improved. I believe that with regards to the ongoing confrontation between Russia and Ukraine, Russia imprudently let loose a Pandora's box. I compare the crisis between Russia and Ukraine to a mere quarrel between two brothers over a meaningless swampland. If they continue, one of them will inevitably plunge into the abyss. People like myself, who watch international disputes on television from the comfort of their living rooms, may not be able to relate to their consequences. It may, however, have an impending effect on hundreds of thousands of people who have involuntarily gotten involved in it. When I initially learned about Putin's conduct in the Russian-Ukrainian conflict, I had plenty of questions going through my mind, sol decided to talk to my father about it. He said, "Let him be. He's just another victim of his own inferiority complex". It's true, in my opinion. If Putin wanted to start a full-fledged war, he would have targeted equally powerful countries like the United Kingd'om or the United States, not a tiny one like Ukraine. He knew Ukraine wasn't as strong as Russia. He deliberately poked them in order to prove his superiority, but it has proven to be a vain attempt. Remember the lableak theory? It holds that the coronavirus, or COVID-19, an infectious condition brought on by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, may have originated in a Chinese laboratory. Let's not get too into the details, but there are still a lot of concerns about why they generated such a deadly virus and who backed it. Nevertheless, my point is that biological weapons are equally as deadly as atomic bombs. It is believed that every person is weak at birth. He or she is reliant on those around them. This vulnerability progresses to emotional dependency, which then progresses to inferiority or superiority complexes. As a result, individuals could look for leadership roles to stifle these inward impulses. (The term 'inferiority complex' was first used by the psychoanalyst Alfred Adler).

The average person rarely participates in hostilities; rather, it is usually the world leaders who promote them. These 'leaders' profess to be so charitable, but their actions prove otherwise. Humans will always have their egos and inferiority complexes. This trait of human nature will always exist. I believe that having a desire for war is a form of mental defect. A rational person wouldn't want to murder their fellow humans. Humans' mental health problems can be resolved if they are taken seriously from a young age. For life is not an illusion but a reality. Our school curriculum may include every nuance of knowledge known to man, yet it is deficient in instruction on fundamental life skills, emotional intelligence, and mental wellness. Since the human psyche begins to form at a young age, empathy and understanding of one another's emotional needs must be taught from an early age. When you reach adolescence, the lessons you've learned stay with you forever, and you can never go back and undo the things you've
