Deva Matha College conducted a UGC - Sponsored add on Course in Human rights in The Academic Year 2021-22. 35 students from different batches attended the course. The classes were engaged by professionals from different institutions. Syllabus was covered on time and the examinations also were conducted.

OFFLINE SESSION (21stMAY) 2022

Prof. Joseph Sir discussed about our rights as human we have in our country (India) including Natural Rights, Moral Rights, Legal Rights, Civil Rights etc. When is Human Rights celebrated, it's importance along with Magna-carta, Petition of Rights, and the most significant one that an Indian should be aware of - our Indian Constitution, Preamble, a detailed understanding of each Articles under Universal Declaration of Human Rights, half of 6 Fundamental Rights of Indian Constitution along with the Constitutional Articles related to them; all these were covered in detail during the session.

Prof. Joseph Sir continued by refreshing what we have been taught in the previous session. In the other half of the session, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties, especially the Constitutional Rights under each Article related to Women and Legal Rights for Women and Child, an explanation of Frame work of Indian Parliament and its members, Method of voting and make us aware of the important days such as World Environment Day, Voter's Day, Drugs Day etc. were covered shortly. It was an interactive session; questions were asked and gifts were distributed to those who have responded correctly.

OFFLINE SESSION (28thMAY) 2022

It was our last session addressed by Adv. Sam Sunny, Pala. He mentioned about the Fundamental Rights, Articles related to Women in detail and some of his case studies he

performed, for a better understanding on the subject. The History of Indian Constitution, Natural Rights, Dowry Laws in India and Laws for Women and Child were also discussed. Students raised their doubts, which were cleared by the resource person.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To know the basics of Human Rights, Govt. Initiatives, Role of United Nations and Universal Declaration of Human Rights 1948.
- 2. To know the Constitutional approach including basic features of the constitution, fundamental rights and duties and their co-relation with International rights and duties.
- 3. To understand the Extent of violation of these rights and what measures have been taken so far to control them.

ModuleIII - Human Rights and Duties in India - Evolution: Independence movement, Making of the Constitution- Indian Constitution: Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles, Fundamental Duties, Their Interrelationship - Enforcement and Protection Mechanism of Human Rights in India: Judiciary, National Human Rights Commission and other Commission and Committees, Non-governmental Organizations, Information Media, Education.(10 Hours)

ModuleIV - Redressal Mechanism for Human Rights Violations – Judiciary – Government systems for Redressal – National Human Rights Commission and other

Statutory Commissions – Media Advocacy – Creation of Human Rights Literacy and Awareness.(5 Hours)

ModuleV - Deprivation of Human Rights: the Core Issue – Poverty, Over population, illiteracy- Problems of Unsustainable Development – Disadvantaged Groups – Women, Children, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, Physically and Mentally Handicapped- Combating Corruptions- Right to information. (5 Hours)

OUTCOME OF THE COURSE

- 1. At the end of the course, students are aware about Human Rights & Fundamental Duties.
- 2. The students become more interested to aware about Human rights & Social Responsibilities.
