Mentoring

The major purpose of Mentoring is listening, as it is the key to an effective communication. Lack of listening leads to breaks in communication, making the person on the other end frustrated. Effective listening is a skill that underpins all positive human relationships. Moreover, in this modern world, people are busy, making individuals all alone and sharing their feelings impossible. So, in that sense also listening, the feeling of someone is there to hear me, is precious. As by-products, mentoring includes encouraging, sharing experiences, giving help, advice and guidance to mentees and pointing them to other sources of support or referral. A well-structured Three Tier Mentoring System is following in Deva Matha College Kuravilangad. At the base level, one faculty is allotted as mentor to a group of students (mentees). In our system, mentors perform different functions that are beneficial to the mentees. At the middle level, Heads of the Departments play a vital role in the mentoring system by monitoring the progress in its processing. At the top level, IQAC acts as a tool to streamline and monitor the mentoring activity in various departments. On the basis of feedback from mentors, the Mentoring Co-ordinator in consultation with IQAC, offers support of external expert to needy mentees. The college is responsible for providing training, advice and on-going guidance to the mentors.

Student Support and Progression

The college has an active student support mechanism equipped to provide financial, academic and emotional support. Financial help in the form of scholarships and free ships, both from government sources and non-governmentsources has been awarded to students during the period. Alumni, well-wishers, PTA and the college management also provide financial assistance to students. Academic support is maintained through effective mentoring and programmes like WWS and SSP which ensure constant student support. The college has a regular mechanism for students' counsellingthrough teacher mentors and certified professional. The institution has various clubs and subject associations which organize skills enhancement and capacity building sessions. Career Guidance Forum arranges sessions related to careers, higher education options and training for competitive examinations. The college has a very transparent mechanism for Grievance redressal and has established all statutory committees like Anti Ragging Cell and Squad, Grievance Redressal Cell, Internal Complaints Committee for Sexual Harassment, Internal Complaints Committee for the disabled, Gender Justice Forum and Equal Opportunity Forum. Students' progression is well monitored and the percentage of students progressing to higher education is around 60 % on an average for Undergraduate Programmes. Campus placement drives and job fairs are organized. Student Participation in activities is very high and vibrant with diverse clubs and subject associations that offer a platform for skill development and nurturing of talents. Students have been the recipients of several prizes and achievements at the National/ State Level art, cultural and sports competitions. Annual Athletic meet and arts fest are held regularly.

'Walk with the Scholar' Programme

The College also conducts 'Walk with the Scholar' Programme which is intended for the fast learners and the

'Scholar Support Programme' which caters to the needs of the slow learners. Special mentoring is provided under these programmes. Again, with the aim of bringing every student a step ahead, remedial classes are also arranged by the teachers. The knowledge base acquired by the fast learner is made use of, by engaging them in peer teaching sessions either for their co-students or students of lower classes.
