2. HUMAN RIGHTS PROGRAMMES

2.1. Tibetan Refugee Poet Tenzin Tzundue met the students: 11 Dec. 2017

Tenzin Tsundue is a poet, writer and Tibetan activist. He won the first-ever Outlook-Picador Award for Non-Fiction in 2001. He has published four books to date which have been translated into several languages: Crossing the Border(1999), Kora (2002), Semshook (2007), Tsen-göl (2012). Tsundue's writings have also appeared in various publications around the world including the International PEN, *Outlook*, and The Times of India. Tenzin Tsundue joined Friends of Tibet (India) in 1999 and is the current General Secretary. Tsundue lives in Dharamshala, North India.

The Tibetan cause is one of the most severe cases of human right violations in the world. Several millions of Tibetans are forced to leave their homeland and live as refugees in different parts of the world, mostly in India. We thought that bringing Tenzin Tzundue to the college and giving our students a chance to interact with him will be a golden opportunity for our students to understand the various dimensions of the refugee problem and the human right violations involved in it. Tzundue was happy to accept our invitation, and we had a very nice and informative session with him in the college campus.

They are a floating population for whom homeland is a foggy dream and life in the present is a burning experience. He said that using force against a defenceless people is a form of cowardice. He said that the Chinese citizens must be ashamed of their government for brutally oppressing the Tibetans and violating their basic human rights.

3 NATIONAL INTEGRATION PROGRAMMES

Baul Song: Know Your Culture Programme

"Know Your Culture Programme" is designed by the NSS unit of Devamatha College, Kuravilangad in the academic year 2017-18 in order to introduce to our students various forms of cultural expressions and unique ways of life indicative of the cultural diversity of India. A knowledge of the cultural diversity is paramount to the notion of national integration. We thought it wise to launch the programme with a presentation of *Baul Song*, typical of the culture of Bengal. In response to our invitation, a team of six Bauls visited our college and performed before the whole college. The Department of English is our associate in launching this prestigious and most relevant programme.

Baul or Bauls (Bengali: বাটিল) are a group of mystic minstrels from Bengal, which includes the country of Bangladesh and the Indian State of West Bengal. Bauls constitute both a syncretic religious sect and a musical tradition. Bauls are a very heterogeneous group, with many sects, but their membership mainly consists of Vaishnava Hindus and Sufi Muslims. They can often be identified by their distinctive clothes and musical instruments. Not much is known of their origin. Lalon is regarded as the most important poet-practitioner of the Baul tradition.^{[3][4][5]} Baul music had a great influence on Rabindranath Tagore's poetry and on his music (Rabindra Sangeet). Bauls have devised their own traditional musical instruments, the most important one of which is "Ektara", a single stringed veena.

Although Bauls comprise only a small fraction of the Bengali population, their influence on the culture of Bengal is considerable. In 2005, the Baul tradition was included in the list of "Masterpieces of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity" by UNESCO.

Baul music celebrates celestial love, but does this in very earthy terms, as in declarations of love by the Baul for his bosh-tomi or lifemate. With such a liberal interpretation of love, it is only natural that Baul devotional music transcends religion and wipes out the superficiality of religious divisions and parochialism.

4. GO ORGANIC PROGRAMMES

Organic farming is a topic that has gained a lot of relevance and currency today. Imprudent ways of cultivation with the unwise use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides has made our soil filled with toxins and poisons. The vegetable, cereals, pulses and many other agricultural products that we produce have thus become capsules of diseases. The result is an unhealthy and diseased generation who does not know how to choose between healthy and unhealthy food habits.

NSS unit of Devamatha College has a clear vision about its responsibility in giving students the right kind of message in this respect. For the last three years, the unit has undertaken various kinds of organic farming practices which has given the students remarkable exposure to alternate ways of cultivation and eating habits. The unit has organized various awareness programmes on organic farming as well as actual cultivation. The following is list of various organic farming activities we have undertaken in the academic year 2017-18.

4.1. Jaivam 2017

Jaivam 2017 is a mega campaigne organized by the National Service Scheme of Mahatma Gandhi University in order to spread the message of organic farming. As part of the campaigne, all colleges under MG University conducted special camps in every panchayat in Kottayam district with a view to converting Kottayam district into a district that has acquired 100% organic literacy. Devamatha College also actively participated in the campaigne. The programme officer Dr. Jaison P. Jacob served as the Taluk level coordinator for Vaikom Taluk. Our NSS unit selected Kuravilangad gramapanchayat as its area of activity.

85 volunteers from our college participated in the inaugural session held at the university. Sri. George Mullakkara, state president of Kerala Jaiva karshaka samiti, took an awareness class for the volunteers on 21 August 2017 followed by training in methods of organic farming. The campaign was highly successful. The local population gave a highly nositive response to the programme. The local body gave their whole-hearted cooperation. The students also benefited greatly. Many of them opined that it was a novel experience for them which was highly informative and enlightening.

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4.2. Organic Vegetable Cultivation

Our unit undertook vegetable cultivation in the campus in organic way. We had a very good harvest. Only organic manure like cow dung and jeevaamrutham, and organic pesticides like neem oil were used for the cultivation.

The percentage of paddy cultivation is becoming less and less every year and the people of Kerala are depending more and more on other states for getting their staple food. We believe that our fallow land cultivation has given our students positive experiences and examples that would call their attention to this serious problem. 





The Women's Forum of DevaMatha College Kuravilangad had conducted an Education Promotion for Okhi affected Girls on 13th February 2018. Cyclone Ockhi, which battered Lakshadweep, Tamil Nadu and Kerala on November 29, 2017, before heading towards Gujarat, had killed 143 fishermen in Kerala. Only 52 bodies could be recovered, while the remaining 91 missing fishermen were declared dead. So, apart from counselling, we closely monitored the situation of families who have lost their breadwinners. It has been decided to give top priority to the education of children and the education fund was provided to them with the help of the Vienna Malayali Association.
