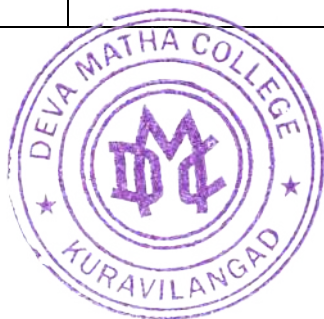

Brief Report

The NCC unit of Deva Matha College Kuravilangad planned and executed the mass production and distribution of masks to curb the spreading pandemic. It was a concerted effort of NCC cadets, the parent-teachers association (PTA), college staff, and the Anugraha Charitable Trust. The objective was to sew 50,000 masks and distribute them to the general population via official channels. The programme had three phases. 50 cadets who had a sewing machine at home helped with the effort to make masks.

E- Waste Collection Campaign in adopted village

The NSS unit of DMC in association with the local self government of Kuravilangad and the wholehearted support of the ward member of the adopted village Mr. Shyju Pavuthiyel campaigned for E- Waste collection as a key activity of the three day camp in advance. The date and schedule of e-waste collection was published in newspapers well ahead of time. The Rotary Club chapter of Kuravilangad financially aided the collection drive. A small meeting was convened before the students started the collection of wastes from each house in Kuravilangad. Mr. P.C Kurian, Panchayath President, Mr. Shyju Pavuthiyel, Ward member and Programme officers addressed the students gave directions. The volunteers were divided into 20 groups of five members and given an average of 15 houses for e-waste collection. The drive, first of its kind in the Panchayath, received oodles of support and welcome from every households. The students passed around brochures on FAQs about e- waste management while visiting. By 12: 30 pm the students completed the massive task by collecting a whopping 340 Kgs of electronic waste. The collected waste was handed over the next day to authorized e-waste management partners in Kottayam for further disposal.

INAUGURATION



Inauguration of the camp

The registration desk started functioning at 3:30 pm at Government H.S.S. Kadappoor. The inauguration ceremony commenced at 5:00 pm. The ceremony opened with volunteers' harmonious rendition of the NSS anthems. Mrs. Praseedha Mathew, the NSS Program Officer welcomed the chief guest and other dignitaries. The presidential address was delivered by Shri. Divakaran Kappilorathu, Kanakkari Panchayath Ward Member. The camp was inaugurated by Shri. Binoy P. Cherian, Kanakkari Panchayath President. The key-note address was given by Shri. Zacharias Kuthiravellil, Chairman Health Education Standing committee. The meeting was enlightened with the words of our College Principal, Dr. Jojo K. Joseph, Shri. Shaji Mathew (Principal, Govt. HSS, Kadappoor), Fr. Dinoy Mathew (Vice-Principal, Deva Matha College), and Sri. Adv. A. K. Babu (PTA President, Govt H.S.S. Kadappoor). Adarsh P. Pradeep, volunteer secretary of the NSS unit thanked all the dignitaries.

He broke the comfort zones and limits existing among the volunteers and prepared themselves for the camp through various activities. The volunteers were divided into six groups and ex-volunteer secretary assigned the duties for them. After the dinner, the program officer's gave the general directions to be followed in the camp.

Beginning of the Cleanliness Campaign

The second day was begun with yoga, instructed by Master Nevil George, leader of the college yoga team. Later by 7:15 am the activities of the day began with the assembly. The assigned volunteers from the designated group presented the thought of the day, news of the day, camp news, camp report, etc. The instructions and the duties of the day were given by the programme officer to the volunteers.

One of the main objectives of the seven day camp of the year was to join with the activities of Suchitwa Mission. As part of this, the forenoon session of the first two days, from 9:00 am to 12:30 pm the volunteers cleaned the surroundings of the camp site, Govt. H.S.S. Kadappoor. One group was assigned with kitchen duty. Other five groups were given different areas for cleaning. Each group was provided with the required

tools by the tools committee. All the groups completed their respective duties within the assigned time periods .plastic waste littered around was collected and it was segregated from biological wastes and was disposed separately.

The cleanliness mission undertaken by the NSS unit of Deva Matha College Kuravilangad was designed to implement the project on three different phases.

- a. Conducting awareness programmes on waste management
- b. Cleaning the areas using man power, segregating and disposing the waste systematically.
- c. training on a plastic free- sustainable life style-

The cleaning campaigns students undertake during the morning sessions in the camp focused on the first phase of the cleanliness campaign. The afternoon session began at 2:30 pm was engaged by Mr. Bijeesh P. Biju, former volunteer secretary. The session was titled as ***Alternatives to plastic Products***. This was a hands on training session for the students on making quality paper bags that can be used in various purposes. The selected members from different groups were trained initially by the resource person and the trained group passed on the method to the larger group. A number of 250 paper bags were made by the students in two consecutive sessions of the same resource person. A group of volunteers started writing unique slogans emphasizing the necessity of a plastic free lifestyle. Adv. Mons Joseph M.L.A. visited the camp and inaugurated paper bag mission by 4 p.m. meanwhile another group of students were writing pamphlets showing the university's key concepts of the cleanliness campaign. The paper bags and the handwritten pamphlets were made to distribute to the people of Kadappoor Grama Panchayathu on the day the students visit them for spreading the cleanliness campaign. The day ended with cultural programs.

Day 3, 08-09-2019

Volunteers welcomed a new day with Yoga under the guidance of Yoga master Nevil George of Deva Matha College. The assembly was held at 7:15 and the procedures were followed.

The day's task was the completion of the cleaning process in the school campus initiated the previous day. Work was divided among the various groups and each of them completed their respective tasks assigned by noon. The school compound was thoroughly cleaned, waste collected was segregated and disposed separately. Also, the road to the school which had been muddy was made convenient for easy conveyance.

Added to this was the VEO’s tip to tackle such issues and make the villagers know about the problems of plastic waste disposal when left unattended. The session was followed by cultural programmes.



Day 4, 09-09-2019

The day began with March-past in the school and it was a first time experience for many volunteers. The assembly took place at the same time and the procedures were followed thoroughly.

The fourth day witnessed the most important initiative that volunteers took which was the execution of the 'Haritha Gramam Suchitwa Gramam' mission .Infact minimizing plastic use and encouraging in doing the same was the prime objective. Volunteers visited homes in the locality along with the paper bags and the awareness leaflets they made during the past days. Meanwhile,they also took surveys on the ways the villagers in the neighbourhood disposed their plastic wastes.The entire group of volunteers returned by noon .



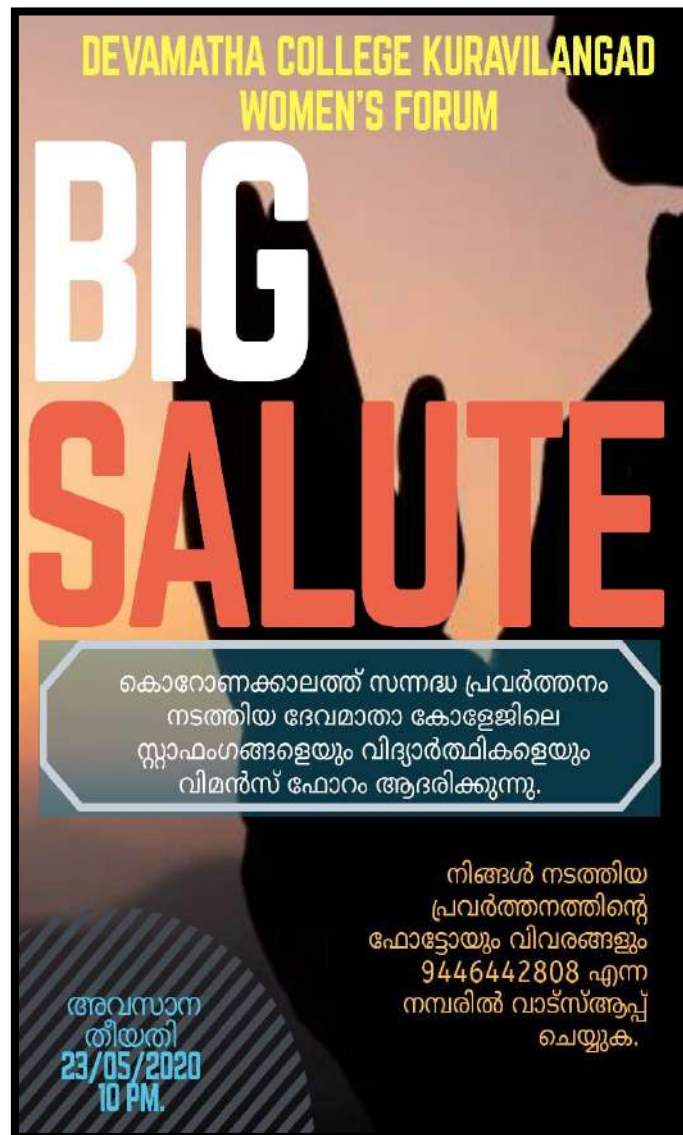
