REPORT

The NSS unit of DMC in association with the Delhi based, Ministry of Human Resource recognized NGO, SAKSHI, organized a workshop on **Gender Equality and POCSO Act 2012**. Dr. Ramya Nisal (Consultant General Surgeon) and volunteer of Sakshi coordinated the online workshop. The volunteers were familiarized with POCSO ACT, instances of sexual violence and the history of laws related to physical violations in India. Sakshi offered the opportunity to be enrolled with them to act as wardens who could identify sexual violences against children in their localities and spread awareness against child abuse of all manners.

< The Rakshin Project online webinar

Sakshi (NGO, regd. 1992) focuses on the empowerment of youth, women, children and marginalized groups on ending gender violence, child sexual abuse, strengthening systematic mechanisms, law reforms, and enabling practice of Everyday Equality in our society. Sakshi has the mandate from the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports to deliver capacity building workshops in partnership with NSS with their volunteers to strengthen Youth with (1) the Awareness Sessions on rights and responsibilities for Gender Equality, (2) Orientations and Capacity Building for compliance of POCSOA 2012.

According to the 2014 Report, National Crime Bureau, 1 in 2 children are survivors of CSA - one of the most dangerous & prevalent yet under-reported crimes in our country. Over 600 cases of child abuse were reported every month during the pandemic as based on the reports provided by Childline India.

In the wake of the Covid-19, we have been advised to refrain from delivering workshops in the colleges, which caused the Rakshin Online module, through which we wish to reach parts of India, which earlier were difficult to access.

At the end of these sessions, the NSS POCSOA Champions will be equipped with

- 1) The capacity to prevent, prohibit and intervene in instances of sexual offences against children.
- 2) If any of them have been subjected personally, they will be guided towards tools that resolve and heal the residue PTSD.
- 3) These Champions will be sufficiently exposed to the various situation-based problems where they can take necessary actions to tackle cases of violence both for themselves and others.

Steps:

1. Time duration of the online webinar/session will be approximately of 1:45-2:00 hrs.
2. The webinar will be organized by NSS through regular interactions with your Institution.
3. During the meeting, students will be taken through the content detailed in the concept note through a Talk and experimental exercises including role plays and films.
4. A link will be given where students can enrol for the webinar session and stay updated.

Over two hundred participants attended the webinar. The webinar began at 9.30 AM with the compère welcoming everyone. The program started with a prayer song by Kum. Shonima P.S. The welcome speech was made by Ms. Sandra George, Joint Convener, Women’s Forum. At 9.45 AM, Ms. Anu P. Mathew, Asst. Professor, Department of Commerce gave an introduction to NCW. Next, the Principal of Deva Matha College, Dr. Sunil C. Mathew gave the presidential address. Mr. Subin Varghese, Asst. Professor in the Dept. of English introduced Justice C.N. Ramachandran Nair (Chairman, Kerala Dam Safety Authority) who was the resource person for the first talk “Unequal Pay for Equal Work: The Social Injustice”. The speaker gave insights on the mandatory provisions in the constitution which considers the welfare of all citizens irrespective of gender and also cited examples of unconstitutional ways in which female employees are targeted by their employers. 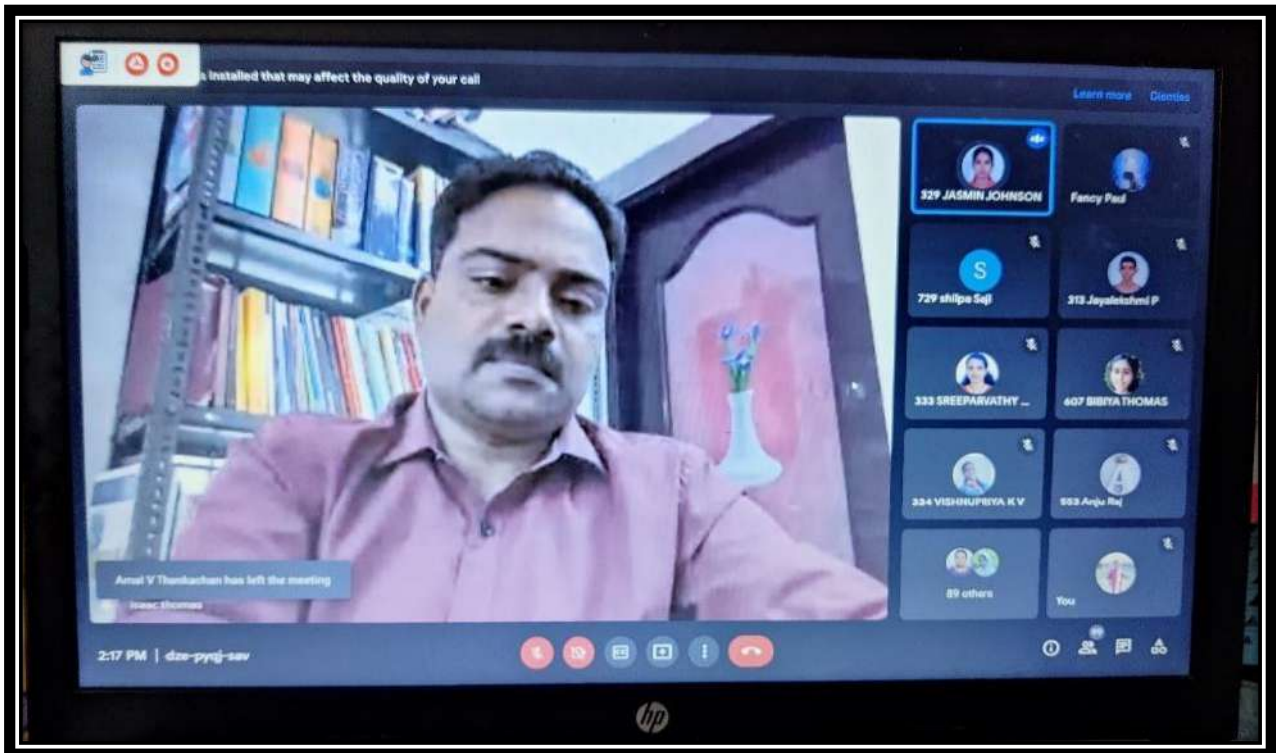
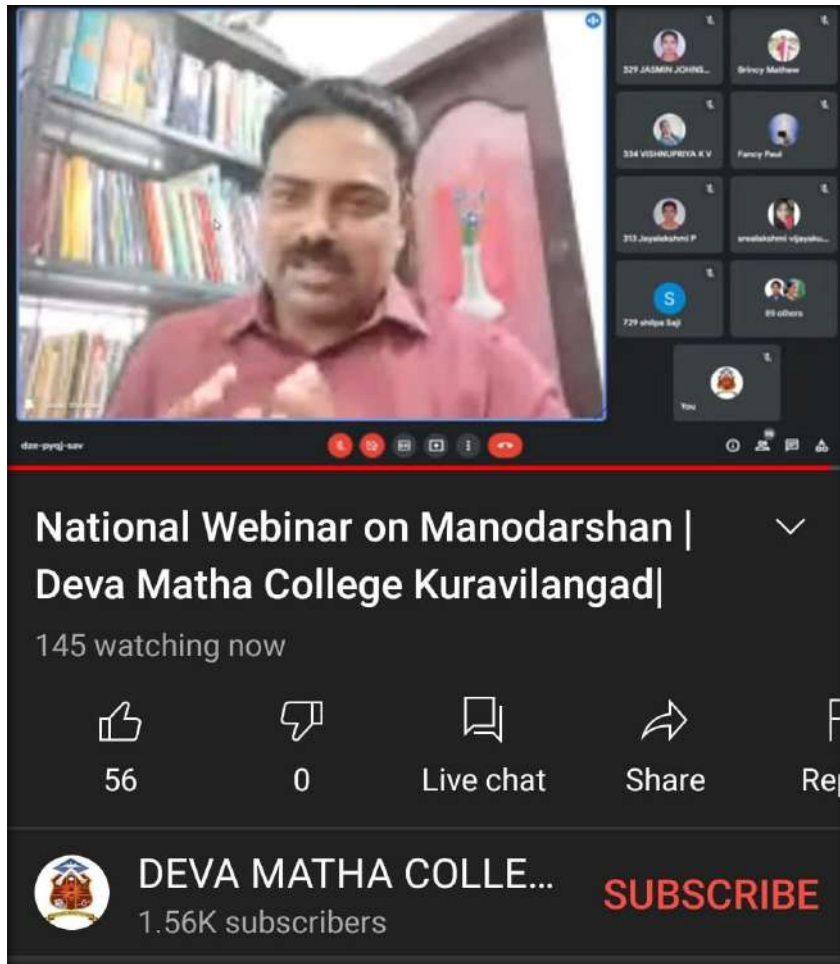

A one-day national e-conference on Manodarshan" was conducted on 27th September 2021 organized by the Women's Forum Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad in association with Kerala Association of Professional Social Workers. Over 250 participants attended the e-conference. Participants were welcomed by the compere Swathi (Third year BA English student) at 2:10 and was followed by a silent prayer. The seminar focused on the importance of being healthy both mentally and physically, citing various examples from the everyday life. The seminar was aimed at fostering students understanding emotional well-being and take note of their daily activities and how are they affecting their minds. The welcome speech was given by Ms Brincy Mathew, Assistant Professor in the Department of Malayalam the coordinator of Women's Forum. Dr. Isaac Thomas a counsellor and career Mentor was invited as the speaker for seminar. He has vast experience in mental health field. Elucidating the topic of Mental health and awareness he addressed the students and the staff. Beginning with the basic prospect of health and the factors it is based on, he covered concerning and important topics like anxiety, depression and some commonly spread myths in detail. The seminar started with an interaction session with the students where they shared their views on mental and physical health. The students of UG and PG from all the department actively participated in the tasks given at hand to demonstrate how our mind works. Students also shared their feelings about how they usually feel under pressure. The motive of the seminar was to make the students aware that they are not alone facing these issues but all of them have some stress or worries. Also, the fact that physical and mental health go hand in hand was also exemplified. Expressing the main concern towards the youth with the age group varying from 5- 25 years of age, he discussed the symptoms, causes, consequences and prevention of Mental stress. 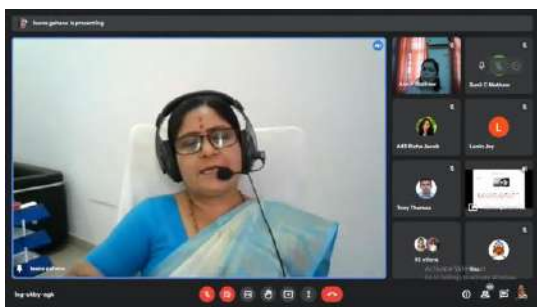


Presidential address by Dr. Sunil C Mathew, Principal of the college

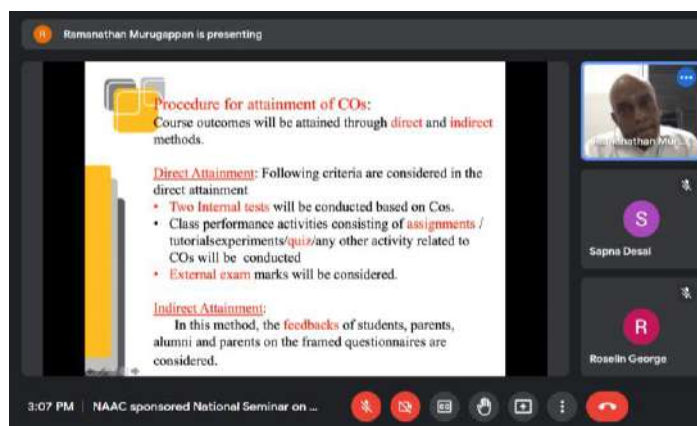
Technical Session III

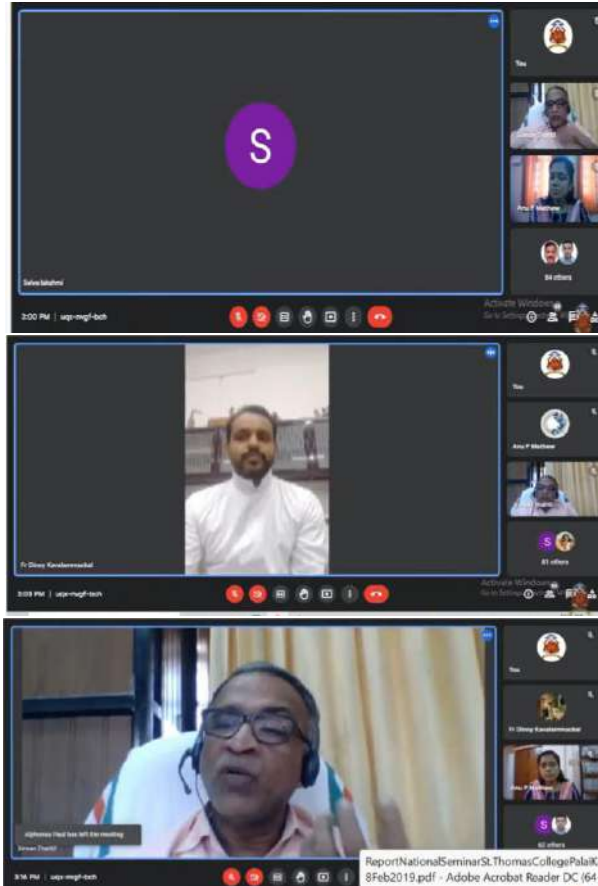
Valedictory session
