Blessing Ceremony of the New PG Labs



Blessing ceremony of the new PG Physics and Chemistry labs was held on 10/8/21 by the College Manager Very Rev. Dr. Augustine Kottiyani. Principal Dr. Sunil C. Mathew, College Bursar Rev. Dr. Joyal Pandaraparambil and Vice Principal Rev. Fr. Dinoy Kavalammakkal were present at this auspicious occasion. The new Physics labs include Optics lab, Electronics lab and General Physics Lab. Each of these labs can accommodate twelve students at a time. The three labs altogether occupy 3600 square feet on the third floor of the new self-financing block. ESR – Spectrometer, Four-Probe apparatus, Quincke's method experimental setup etc. are some among the major facilities available in these labs.



The Chemistry classroom and lab have been widened so as to accommodate 30 students. It is a well-equipped lab with microwave oven, hot air oven and distillation unit for water purification. In addition to these facilities, a computer lab and a highly functionalised physical chemistry lab with polarimeter, refractometer, etc. have been set up. An emergency wash cabin along with a well organised store have also been completed.

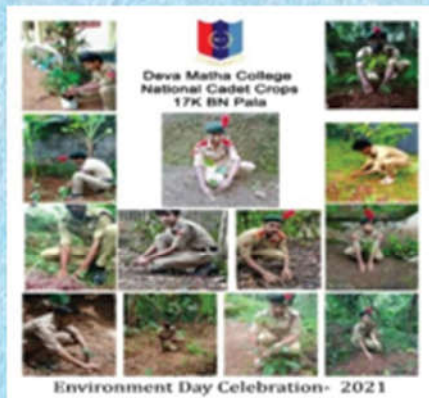

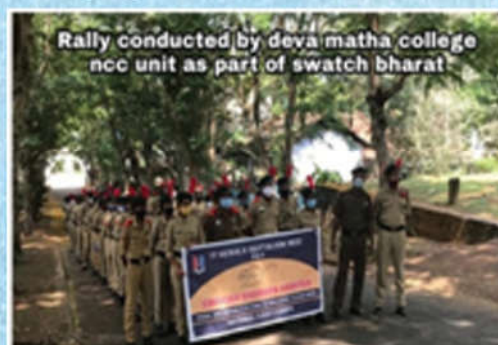
World Blood Donation Day

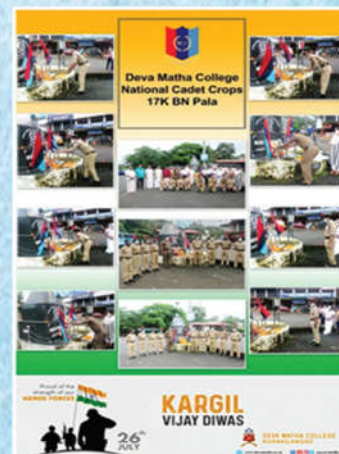


Independence Day

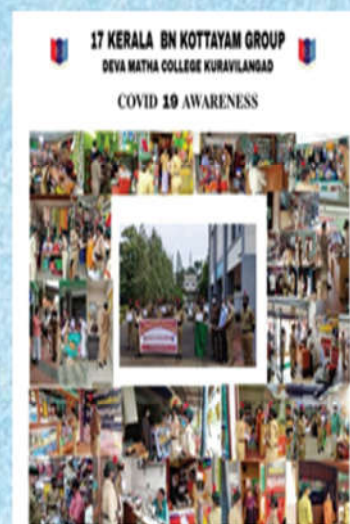

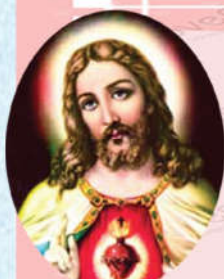
The Department of Physical Education hosted the M.G. University Inter Collegiate Yoga Championship on July 15th. 72 students from different colleges participated in the championship.

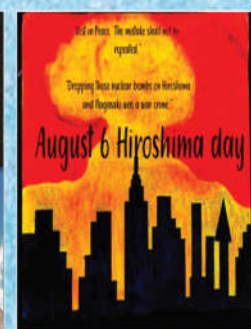
Sundarlal Bahuguna Memorial 'plant a tree' competition

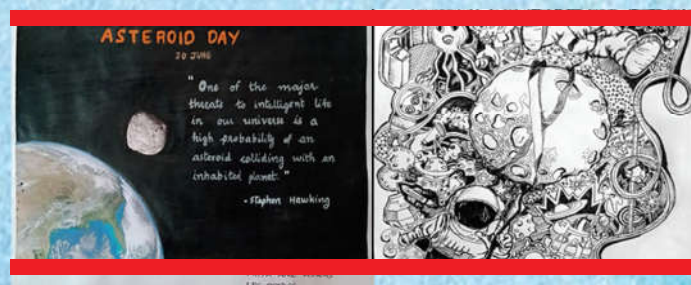
Nasha Mukth Bharath- Paper Presentation Competition

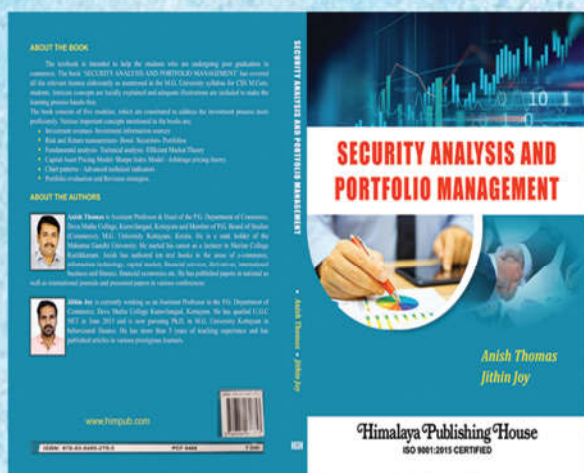
